## Strong refining, marketing momentum to continue

- HPCL's 2QFY26 EBITDA came in at INR76.2b (29% beat), aided by a higher-thanestimated reported GRM of USD8.9/bbl (48% beat). GRM, adj. for inventory gains, stood at USD8/bbl. Marketing margin (including inv.) stood at ~INR5.8/lit (est. INR5.4/lit). The resultant PAT came in 29% above our estimate at INR38.3b.
- The MoP&NG, through letters dated 3<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> Oct'25, approved a compensation of INR79.2b to HPCL for under-recoveries on the sale of domestic LPG up to 31st Mar'25 and those expected up to 31st Mar'26. The amount will be released in 12 equal monthly installments, with accruals recognized monthly starting Nov'25.
- We factor in LPG under-recovery compensation of INR6.6b per month over Nov'25-Oct'26 under revenue. Additionally, we raise our MS/HSD marketing margin assumptions for 2HFY26-FY28 slightly to INR3.5/lit (from INR3.3/lit earlier). These revisions collectively drive a 23/27% upward revision in our FY26/27 EBITDA estimates.
- In line with management's indication of deferring the lubricant business spinoff and associated value unlocking, we exclude the earlier embedded value of ~INR37.5/sh from our TP. We now value HPCL's standalone operations at 6.5x Dec'27E EV/EBITDA (vs 6.5x FY27E earlier), resulting in a revised SoTP-based target price of INR590/sh.
- We continue to prefer HPCL among OMCs due to the following factors: 1) HPCL's higher leverage toward the marketing segment, 2) higher dividend yield as HPCL's capex cycle is tapering off, and 3) start-up of HPCL's multiple mega-projects in the next 12 months, providing a push to earnings.
- HPCL currently trades at 1.4x FY27E P/B. We estimate the company to deliver 29.3%/19.9% RoE during FY26/27 and estimate a 3.6% FY27E dividend yield. Our earnings assumptions remain conservative as we build in a refining GRM of USD6.5/bbl and an MS/HSD gross marketing margin of INR3.5/lit. We have not assumed any significant benefit from 1) the start-up bottom-upgradation unit and 2) Project Samriddhi, which has unlocked savings worth USD0.5/bbl in 1HFY26. We reiterate our BUY rating on the stock with our SoTP-based TP of INR590.

## Key takeaways from the management commentary

- HRRL has achieved 89% overall physical progress, with the refinery section surpassing 95%. Crude feed into the CDU is anticipated within the current calendar year.
- HRRL shall be depreciated over a period of 40 years (~INR20b depreciation p.a.). Interest cost shall be ~INR40b p.a. (before refinancing).
- At the Residue Upgradation Facility (RUF) in Visakhapatnam, precommissioning activities were completed on 30 Oct'25.
- The Mumbai refinery, which was temporarily shut down due to contaminated fuel, is now fully operational and ramping up to its full capacity.
- In 2Q, the Russian crude proportion stood at 5% only.
- **Capex** for 2QFY26 was INR32.6b, bringing the total for 1HFY26 to INR61.2b.
- India's largest LPG storage cavern, with a capacity of 80 TMT, was commissioned in Mangalore during the quarter.

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## Beat fueled by higher-than-estimated GRM

- HPCL's EBITDA stood at INR76.2b (29% beat), aided by a higher-than-estimated reported GRM of USD8.9/bbl (48% beat).
- > Marketing margin (including inv.) stood at ~INR5.8/lit (est. INR5.4/lit). Refining throughput was in line at 6.6mmt. Marketing volumes also came in line at 12.1mmt.
- LPG under-recovery stood at INR12.4b (down 42% QoQ).
- PAT came in 29% above our estimate at INR38.3b. Other income, depreciation, and finance costs were below our estimates.
- However, forex loss stood at INR7.3b. As of Sep'25, HPCL had a cumulative negative net buffer of INR142.4b due to the under-recovery on LPG cylinders (INR130b as of Jun'24).
- As of Sep'25, net debt stood at INR549.2b (vs. INR631.6b as of 31st Mar'25).
- The Board has declared an interim dividend of INR5/sh (FV: INR10/sh).

### Valuation and view

- HPCL remains our preferred pick among the three OMCs. We model a marketing margin of INR3.5/lit for both MS and HSD in 2HFY26/FY27/FY28, while the current MS and HSD marketing margins are significantly above these levels. We view the following as key catalysts for the stock: 1) the commissioning of its bottom-upgrade unit by the end of 3QFY26, and 2) the start of its Rajasthan refinery by Dec'25.
- HPCL currently trades at 1.4x FY27E P/B, which we believe offers a reasonable margin of safety as we estimate FY27E RoE of 19.9%. We value the stock at our SoTP-based TP of INR590. Reiterate BUY.

## Key highlights from the management commentary

## **Operational performance:**

- In 2Q, HPCL's core GRM stood at ~USD8/bbl (implying a ~USD0.9/bbl inventory gain (~INR3.4b).
- Refining opex is ~USD2.5/bbl.
- Product slate:
- Diesel: 50%
- MS: 20-25%
- Rest: LPG, bottom products, and specialty chemicals
- In 2Q, marketing inventory gain stood at INR5.7b.
- HPCL achieved a quarterly throughput of 6.6mmt (+14% YoY).
- Visakh Refinery posted a record quarterly crude throughput of 3.98mmt, while
   Mumbai Refinery recorded 2.59mmt.
- The company has processed one new crude grade during the quarter, taking the total number of new grades processed in 1HFY26 to five.
- The company achieved a pipeline throughput of 6.12mmt during 2QFY26.
- Market sales volume for the quarter reached a record 12.07mmt (including exports) (+3.9% YoY).
- Combined sales of Petrol (MS) and Diesel (HSD) stood at 7.07mmt, (+2.8% YoY),
   while total LPG sales (domestic and non-domestic) reached 2.39mmt (+5.9% YoY).
- The aviation business recorded a growth of 6.1% during the quarter, vs. the industry decline of 2%



 A Joint Development and Cooperation Agreement (JDCA) was signed with Technology partner M/s Lummus Technology, USA, for the commercialization of HP-NTO technology

### Russian crude:

- > 2Q: 5% proportion (1Q: 13.2% proportion). Hence, if the Russian crude share goes to zero, HPCL will not have a very big impact.
- > The proportion of West-African crude increased in 2Q. A major source for HPCL is the Middle East.

## Update on ongoing projects:

- India's largest LPG storage cavern, with a capacity of 80 TMT, was commissioned in Mangalore during the quarter.
- HPCL Rajasthan Refinery Limited (HRRL) has achieved 89% overall physical progress, with the refinery section surpassing 95%. Of the thirteen process units, three Diesel Hydrotreating (DHDT), Hydrogen Generation Unit (HGU), and Crude/Vacuum Distillation are currently in the pre-commissioning stage. Crude feed into the Crude Distillation Unit (CDU) is anticipated within the current calendar year.
- Within three months, the refinery section shall be capable of running at 100%.
   Without petchem, it would run at ~8mmtpa.
- Current debt is ~INR400b.
- Refinery shall be depreciated over a period of 40 years (~INR20b depreciation p.a.).
- Interest cost shall be ~INR40b p.a. (before refinancing).
- HRRL shall not be consolidated.
- At the Residue Upgradation Facility (RUF) in Visakhapatnam, pre-commissioning activities were completed on 30 Oct'25. The ISBL hydrogen and flare headers have been successfully commissioned. Integrity testing of the unit under high-pressure and high-temperature conditions using hydrogen has been completed, and catalyst loading is currently underway.
- Full impact shall be visible from Feb'26.

## ■ Chlorine contamination:

- Part refinery was down, and the other part was running at a lower throughput.
- The part refinery is now up and running.
- Impact:
- Naphtha of ~100tmt had to be exported at a discount, resulting in an excess loss of INR1.5b.
- Other activities took ~INR1.5b.

## Project Samriddhi:

- Under Project Samriddhi, the company's EBITDA enhancement initiative, accruals during 1HFY26 amounted to INR8.2b, translating to ~USD0.52/bbl.
- > 35% of the accrual amount is recurring, and the rest is one-time.
- > The company believes it to exceed the target of INR10b set for FY26.

## Lubricant business spin-off:



- The company is now focusing on the consumer side of the business. The business is growing at high-teens.
- > The spinoff decision has been postponed as of now.

### Future initiatives:

- Focus on non-fuel retail.
- > Barmer petchem stream to go online in the middle of next year.
- Working to expand gas portfolios with two gas fields already announced.

## ■ HP Green R&D Centre (HPGRDC):

- By 30 Sep'25, HPGRDC filed a total of 684 patents, of which 272 have been granted.
- Capex for 2QFY26 stood at INR32.6b, bringing the total for 1HFY26 to INR61.2b.
- In 2Q, capex split was 30%/60%/10%: refinery/marketing/others.
- > The company will not enter any mega capex cycle before de-leveraging.

## Network expansion:

- In 2QFY26, 351 retail outlets were commissioned, taking the total to 24,252. Additionally, 3 new LPG distributors were added, bringing the total to 6,387.
- > In 2QFY26, 563 inch-km of steel and 116 km of MDPE pipeline were laid under the CGD network. Additionally, 8,950 new domestic PNG connections were added, taking the total to 1,33,410.
- One CBG plant was commissioned during the quarter, taking the total to 17. Additionally, 9 LOIs were issued, bringing the total active LOIs to 136 with a combined capacity of 332 TMT.
- A total of 42 new CNG outlets were commissioned in 2QFY26, bringing the total to 2,113. Additionally, 304 retail outlets were solarized, taking the cumulative count to 22,747.

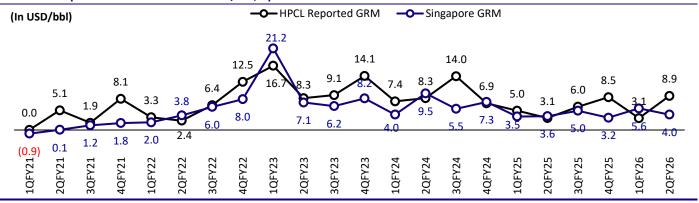

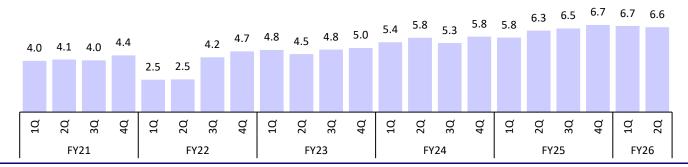
## Exhibit 1: Reported GRM stood at USD8.9/bbl, up ~184% YoY

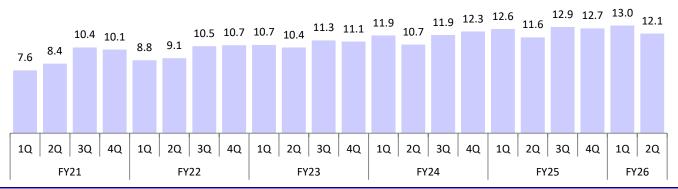
Exhibit 2: Throughput was 6.6mmt, up ~4% YoY

Exhibit 3: Marketing volumes grew ~4% YoY to 12.1mmt

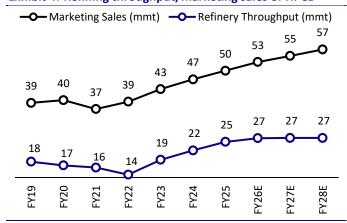

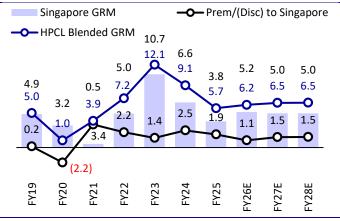

## Exhibit 4: Refining throughput/marketing sales of HPCL



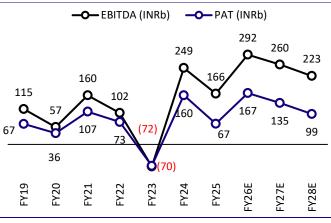

## **Exhibit 5: GRM trend of HPCL**



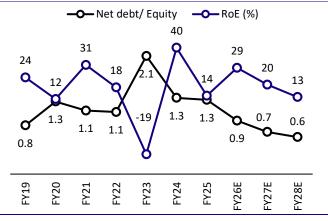

**Exhibit 6: EBITDA vs. PAT (standalone)** 



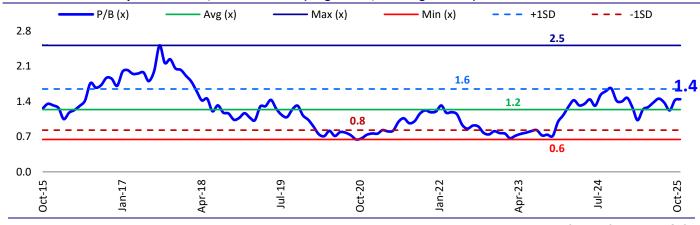


## **Exhibit 7: Standalone ratios**
