Asset quality stress peaks out; earnings set to gain pace

Business growth remains robust

- IDFC First Bank (IDFCFB) reported 2QFY26 PAT of INR3.5b (up 76% YoY/down 24% QoQ, in line).
- NII grew 7% YoY/3.6% QoQ to INR51.2b (in line). NIMs declined 12bp QoQ to 5.6%. Opex grew 13% YoY to INR51.2b (in line).
- Net advances rose 20% YoY/5.5% QoQ. Deposit growth was robust at 24% YoY/4.5% QoQ, with CASA mix improving to 50.1% (up 210bp QoQ).
- GNPA/NNPA ratios declined by 11bp/3bp QoQ to 1.86%/0.52%. PCR ratio was stable at 72.2%.
- We fine-tune our estimates for the bank and expect a healthy CAGR of 20% in loans and 63% PAT during FY25-28E. We estimate RoA/RoE of 1.0%/9.3% for FY27E. Retain our Neutral rating with a TP of INR80, based on 1.4x FY27E ABV.

NIM decline controlled at 12bp QoQ; CASA mix improves to ~50%

- IDFCFB reported 2QFY26 PAT of INR3.5b (up 75% YoY/down 24% QoQ; in line), aided by a lower tax rate, which was partly offset by lower other income.
- NII grew 7% YoY/4% QoQ to INR51.1b (in line). NIMs declined by 12bp QoQ to 5.59%, while provisions stood broadly in line at INR14.5b. Other income grew 9.5% YoY/fell 15.1% QoQ to INR18.9b (6% miss).
- Opex grew 12.5% YoY/4.1% QoQ to INR51.2b (in line). C/I ratio thus rose to 73.2%. PPoP declined 4% YoY/16% QoQ to INR18.8b (largely in line).
- On the business front, net advances grew 19.5% YoY/5.5% QoQ, led by 5.9% QoQ growth in retail finance, 7% QoQ growth in wholesale, and 8% in business banking. Within retail, growth was led by VF (12% QoQ), gold (11% QoQ), credit card (7% QoQ) and consumer (8% QoQ). The share of consumer & rural finance was ~67.4% as of 2QFY26.
- Deposit growth remained robust at 24% YoY/4.5% QoQ, with the CASA mix increasing 210bp QoQ to 50.1%. CD ratio was up 93bp QoQ at 93%.
- GNPA/NNPA ratios declined by 11bp/3bp QoQ to 1.86%/0.52%. PCR ratio was stable at 72.2%. Gross slippages declined to INR22.6b vs. INR24.9b in 1QFY26. SMA book declined to 0.9% vs. 1.01% in 1QFY26.
- Excluding MFI, slippage ratio improved to 3.4% vs. 3.54% in 1QFY26. Excl. MFI, the credit cost for the bank stood at 2.03%. With the stress easing out, the bank expects the credit cost to improve from hereon.



Highlights from the management commentary

- NIMs are expected to improve sequentially and reach ~5.8% in 4QFY26, factoring in one rate cut by the RBI.
- Credit cost is expected at 2.1% for FY26, trending lower at ~1.8% in 2H.
- C/I ratio should trend lower as operating leverage improves from MFI normalization kick-in.
- ECL transition is still under assessment; initial view suggests higher Stage-1/2 provisioning, but overall impact is likely to be neutral or slightly positive when factoring in operational risk weights.

Valuation and view: Maintain Neutral with TP of INR80

IDFCFB reported an in-line quarter, with NII, PPoP, and PAT broadly meeting expectations. The 12bp sequential decline in NIMs was also in line with estimates, and the bank expects margins to improve to 5.8% by 4QFY26, factoring in one repo rate cut. On the business front, deposit traction remained robust, with the CASA mix improving to 50%, while loan growth remained healthy, led by steady momentum across Retail and Business Banking segments. Asset quality saw a marginal improvement, with the SMA book remaining well contained at 0.9%. We expect the C/I ratio to moderate from 70.3% in FY26 to 66.2% in FY27, as revenue growth gains pace and operating leverage begins to play out. We fine-tune our estimates for the bank and expect a healthy loan CAGR of 20% and PAT CAGR of 63% over FY25-28E. We estimate RoA/RoE of 1.0%/9.3% for FY27E and retain our Neutral rating with a TP of INR80, based on 1.4x FY27E ABV.

Highlights from the management commentary

Opening remarks by management

- Customer deposits grew 23% YoY to INR2.69t, supported by healthy growth in retail deposits and traction in bulk deposits. 2Q-end CASA ratio stood at ~50%, with the bank opening 25 branches during the quarter.
- Loan book grew 19.7% YoY to INR2.67t, led by mortgages, consumer loans, and business banking segments.
- Disbursements improved sequentially. The MFI book declined, though disbursements in this segment have started picking up again.
- Credit card base crossed 4m, with spends growing at a healthy pace; launched a co-branded card with IndiGo during the quarter.
- Asset quality and SMA ratios improved sequentially.
- NIMs declined by 12bp QoQ due to the lagged impact of repo transmission seen in 1Q; management indicated that NIMs have now bottomed out.
- Excluding trading gains, core operating profit rose 4.6% QoQ, supported by lower provisioning.
- Provisions declined 12.9% QoQ, led by normalization in the MFI book; ex-MFI, credit cost stood at 2%, broadly stable.
- The bank utilized INR750m from its MFI contingent buffer and continues to hold ~INR2.40b of additional contingent provisions.
- Average LCR stood at 115%, within the guided range.
- Management noted continued improvement in the rural economy and regulatory environment (credit risk weights and LCR relaxation).
- Focus remains on building capabilities, with parallel investments in wealth management and cash management offerings.
- CD ratio was at 94%, with continued focus on strengthening the deposit franchise and repayment of high-cost borrowings.
- Management reiterated that the MFI stress is largely behind, and trends should improve from hereon.

Opex and Other Income

- The C/I ratio has increased temporarily due to asset-side pressures but is expected to improve as operating leverage plays out, once the MFI book stabilizes
- Digitization and network readiness position the bank well to benefit from scaling efficiencies as growth normalizes.

Loan and deposits

- The bank continues to gain market share in two-wheelers, with a visible pickup in VF demand during the quarter-end.
- MFI disbursements have improved and are expected to stabilize by year-end; the segment remains critical for PSL fulfillment. The pace of decline should moderate in 3Q-4Q.
- CA deposits form 14% of CASA, with efforts underway to deepen the CA base.
- The bank remains selective in co-lending, focusing instead on its proprietary origination.



Yields and margins

- NIMs are expected to improve in 3Q and 4Q, with management guiding for ~5.8% NIMs in 4QFY26, even after factoring in repo rate cuts.
- The bank continues to offer higher SA rates (5.85%), lower than comparable FD rates, as part of a strategic focus on SA-driven funding.
- A 50bp reduction in TD rates has already been implemented, and further SA repricing levers exist to aid NIMs structurally.
- Management emphasized that rate actions are long-term franchise-led decisions, not short-term cost plays.

Asset quality

- MFI slippages halved QoQ, while overall slippage ratio (ex-MFI) improved to 3.39% from 3.54%.
- Credit cost expected at 2.1% for FY26, trending lower at ~1.8% in 2H and likely to stabilize in 4Q.
- Unutilized provisions of INR2.4b may be released as MFI conditions normalize further.

Others

- Credit risk RWAs expected to remain positive for capital ratios.
- ECL transition still under assessment; initial view suggests higher Stage-1/2 provisioning, but overall impact likely neutral to slightly positive when factoring in operational risk weights.
- The bank has 5-6 clients with US exposure, all well-rated with secured positions in LAP; management does not foresee material risk.
- Business instalment loans (unsecured) portfolio remains stable; primary exposure to local businesses with improving behavior trends.

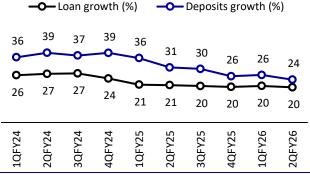
Guidance

- NIMs expected to improve sequentially, likely to reach ~5.8% in 4QFY26.
- C/I ratio to trend lower as operating leverage gains from MFI normalization.
- Credit cost to decline to ~1.8% in 2H, supported by better recoveries and improving unsecured performance.
- Unutilized provisions of INR2.4b to act as a buffer and potential write-back upside.



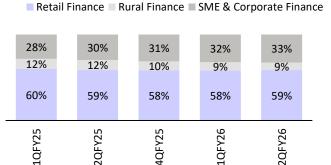

Exhibit 1: Loans/deposits grew 20.3%/23.8% YoY



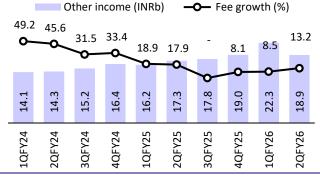

Exhibit 2: Consumer & Rural Finance formed 68% of loans



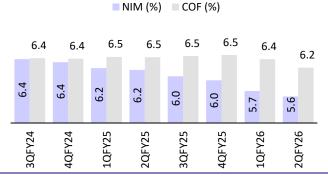

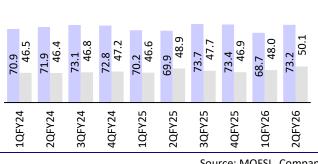
Exhibit 4: NIMs moderated 12bp QoQ to 5.59%

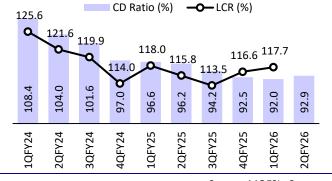
Exhibit 5: C/I ratio increased to 73.2%; CASA ratio at 48%

Exhibit 6: CD ratio increased to 93% in 2QFY26



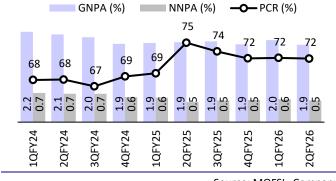

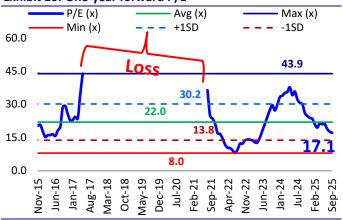
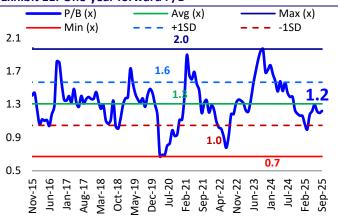


Exhibit 11: One-year forward P/B
