Market Commentary

Indian benchmark indices ended the session on 16th April on a slightly negative note, amid heightened volatility driven by weekly Sensex expiry, despite supportive cues from a stronger Indian rupee and Brent crude hovering near the \$96 mark.

- At close, the Sensex declined by 122.56 points or 0.16% to settle at 77,988.68, while the Nifty slipped 34.55 points or 0.14% to close at 24,196.75.
- On the sectoral front, most indices traded with a positive undertone, with notable gains seen in Nifty Metal, Nifty IT, Media, and Consumer Durables. On the other hand, Nifty Auto and Banking stocks (Private & PSU) emerged as laggards, while the rest of the sectors traded with a mixed bias.
- The broader market outperformed the benchmarks and mirrored a positive sentiment, with the Nifty Midcap 100 rising by 0.63% and the Small cap index gaining 0.89%, indicating continued participation in the broader space.
- Gift Nifty signals a flat to negative opening for the Indian market. Nifty spot in today's session is likely to trade in the range of 24,000-24,400.

Global Updates

- US markets ended slightly higher on Thursday, fueled by hopes for a U.S.-Iran peace deal and the announcement of a ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon.
- Investor sentiment was lifted after Israel agreed to a temporary ceasefire with Lebanon, while U.S. President Donald Trump signaled that Washington and Tehran could resume talks over the weekend, raising hopes for a broader de-escalation in the region.
- The Lebanon ceasefire, expected to last around 10 days, is seen as a potential steppingstone toward wider peace negotiations.
- Economic data released earlier in the day showed U.S. jobless claims falling more than expected, pointing to continued resilience in the labor market and offering further support to equities.
- Asia-Pacific markets opened lower Friday, as cautious optimism over the Middle East conflict tempered sentiment, diverging from Wall Street's record-setting rally.

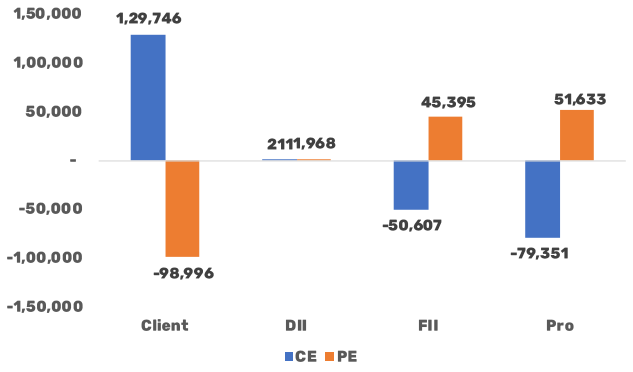

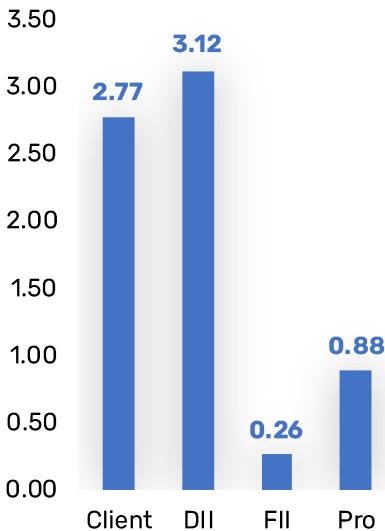
Index Future Participant wise OI Change



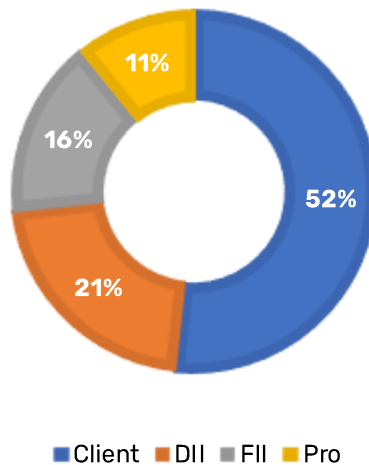
Index Option Participant wise OI Change



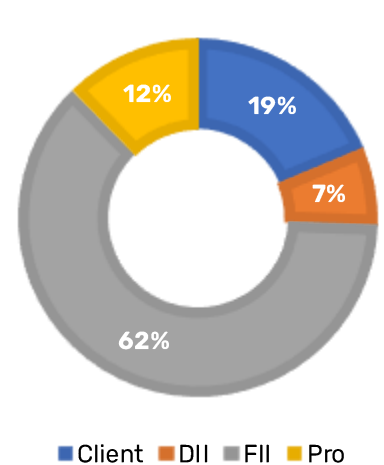
Participant wise L/S Ratio

Nifty Outlook



The index formed a bearish candlestick pattern, registering both a higher high and a lower low, indicating a phase of consolidation amid heightened volatility. On Thursday high Nifty has already retraced more than 50% of its prior decline from 26,373 to 22,183.

On the daily timeframe, the stochastic oscillator has approached the overbought zone following a sharp rally of approximately 2,200 points over the past nine trading sessions. Given this swift upward move, a period of consolidation within the 23,400–24,400 range appears likely in the near term.

Short term support is placed in the 23,450–23,100 zone, which coincides with the recent gap area and the 20-day exponential moving average (EMA). Sustaining above this support band would be crucial for maintaining the current pullback trend.

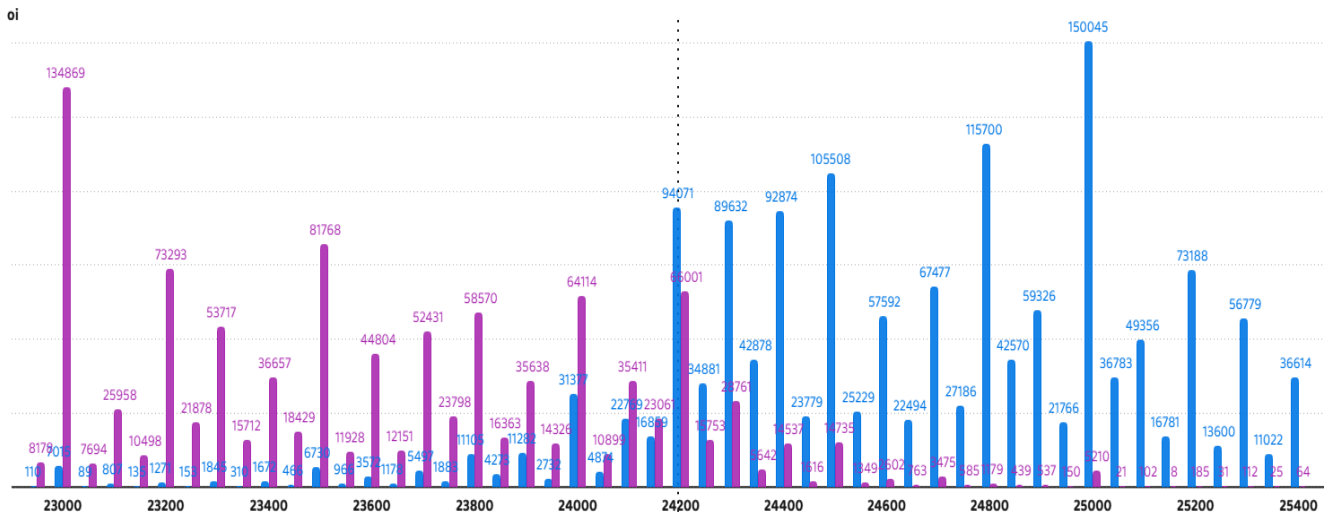
On the upside, a decisive close above 24,400 could act as a trigger for further upside momentum, potentially guiding the index towards the 24,700–24,800 zone. This range represents a confluence of the 200-day EMA and a previous breakdown area.

- ❑ Synthetic futures are placed at 24,186, keeping the index near key pivot levels.
- ❑ Highest call writing is at 25,000, while highest put writing stands at 23,000, defining the broader range.
- ❑ Call writers are dominant above 24,200, with the highest addition at 24,800, indicating resistance placed higher.
- ❑ Below 24,000, call writing remains relatively lighter, with the highest addition at 23,200.
- ❑ The structure reflects a constructive undertone, with resistance gradually shifting upwards.
- ❑ Continued call unwinding, along with a sustained move above 24,200, can trigger further upside towards 24,500.

Bank Nifty Outlook



The index formed a bearish candlestick pattern characterized by a higher high and a lower low, indicating consolidation amid elevated volatility. The index has already retraced more than 50% of its prior decline from 61,764 to 49,955.

On the daily timeframe, the stochastic oscillator has approached the overbought zone following a sharp rally of nearly 7,000 points over the past nine trading sessions. Given the magnitude of this up move, a period of consolidation in the near term cannot be ruled out, with the index likely to trade within the 54,000–57,000 range.

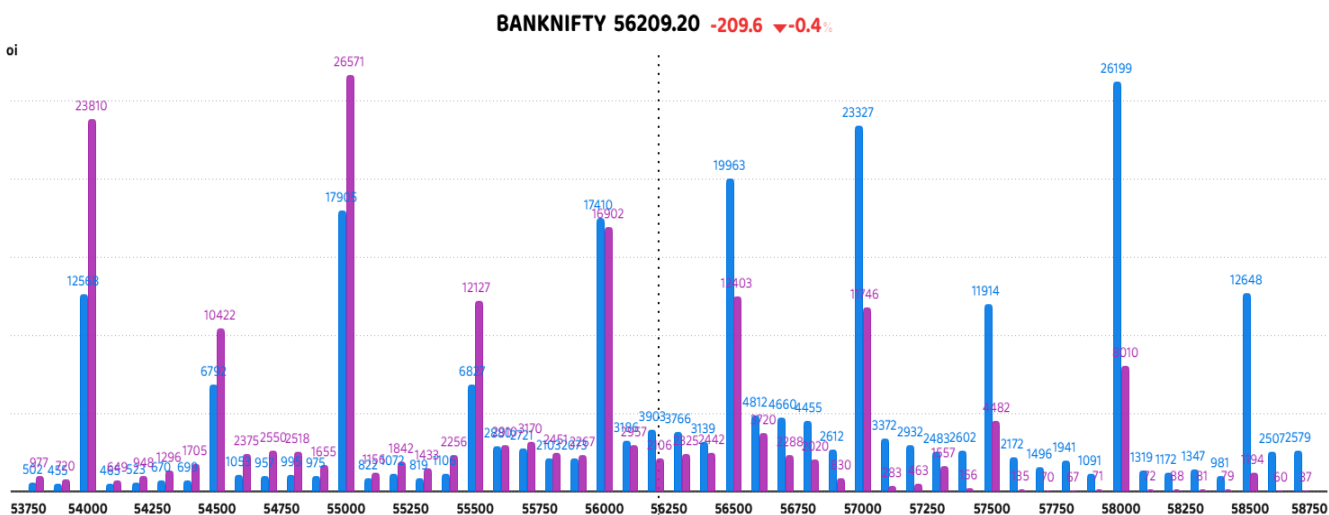
From a short-term perspective, immediate support is placed in the 54,000–53,000 zone, which aligns with the confluence of the recent gap area and the 20-day EMA. Holding above this support band would indicate that the ongoing pullback structure remains intact.

On the upside, a decisive close above the 57,000 marks would signal a continuation of bullish momentum, potentially paving the way for an advance towards the 58,000–59,200 zone. This region coincides with the gap area formed on March 6 and the 78.2% retracement of the recent decline from 61,764 to 49,955.

Bank Nifty Option Chain

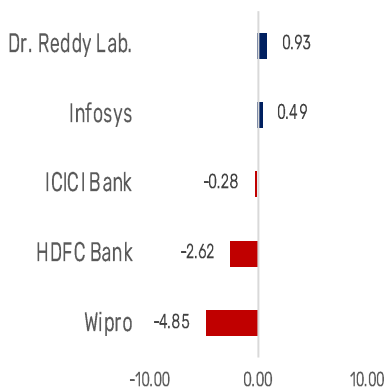


- Highest call writing is at 60,000, while highest put writing is at 55,000, outlining the broader range.
- Straddle formation at 56,000 highlights it as the key pivot level.
- Call writers are active above 56,500, with the highest addition at 61,000, indicating resistance placed at higher levels
- Put writers have unwound positions from 58,000 and remained relatively muted in building fresh positions.
- The structure indicates consolidation with supports holding near lower levels.
- Overall positioning remains constructive with limited downside pressure.

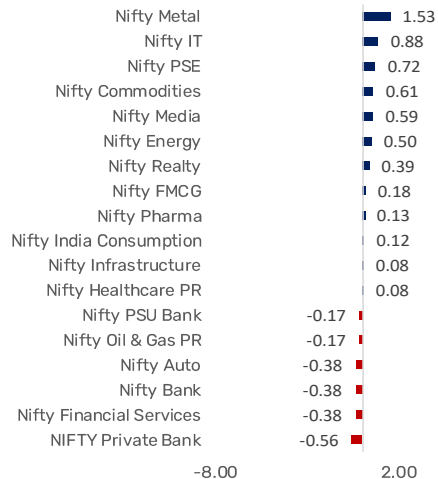

WIPRO Q4FY26 Result Update

Result Update

The company delivered a steady performance for the quarter, with revenue coming in at Rs.242.4 bn, reflecting a healthy 8% year-on-year growth and a modest 3% sequential uptick, broadly in line with expectations. EBIT stood at Rs.42 bn, rising 7% YoY and 17% QoQ, slightly outperforming consensus estimates by 3%, indicating improved operating efficiency. Margins settled at 17.3%, contracting marginally by 15 basis points on a yearly basis but expanding sharply by 214 basis points sequentially, and surpassing expectations by 56 basis points. Profit after tax came in at Rs.35 bn, dipping 2% YoY but rebounding strongly with a 12% QoQ growth, marginally ahead of estimates by 1%, highlighting resilience in bottom-line performance despite some yearly pressure.

Operational Performance

- ❑ IT Services revenue for Q4 FY26 came in at \$2,651 million, reflecting sequential growth of 0.2% in constant currency (CC) and a marginal YoY decline of 0.2% in CC terms.
- ❑ Full-year FY26 IT Services revenue stood at \$10,478 million, a CC decline of 1.6% YoY – marking the second consecutive year of revenue contraction on a constant currency basis.
- ❑ Operating margin for Q4 FY26 was 17.3%, contracting 30 bps sequentially and 20 bps YoY. Margin was weighed down by two incremental months of Harman DTS acquisition consolidation and the impact of the wage hike effective March 1, 2026. Rupee depreciation provided a partial offset.
- ❑ Full-year FY26 operating margin at 17.2% expanded 15 bps YoY, demonstrating disciplined cost management despite headwinds.

WIPRO Q4FY26 Result Update

- ❑ Adjusted net income for Q4 FY26 grew 3.7% QoQ and 2.2% YoY for the full year, reflecting healthy profit conversion despite soft revenue growth.
- ❑ Operating cash flow for FY26 was strong at 112.6% of net income (\$1,591 million), though Q4 standalone cash conversion moderated to 90.1%.
- ❑ Voluntary attrition improved to 13.8% on a trailing twelve-month basis – the lowest in 20 quarters – reflecting stable workforce sentiment in a cautious external environment.
- ❑ Total headcount stood at 242,156, with net additions of 154 in Q4, signaling a deliberate de-linking of headcount from revenue growth as AI-led productivity gains take hold.

Strategic Market Unit (SMU) Performance

- ❑ Americas 1 grew 0.3% QoQ and 2.9% YoY in CC, supported by strong performance in consumer, technology, and communications. Healthcare was a drag due to seasonality and policy-related changes.
- ❑ Americas 2 declined 2.6% QoQ and 6.7% YoY in CC – the key area of concern this quarter. Weakness was concentrated in the BFSI sector, driven by a combination of a client-specific issue (expected to be fully resolved by end of Q1 FY27) and delayed ramp-ups on previously won large deals. Management indicated this is not a structural or macro-driven issue.
- ❑ Europe grew 2.0% QoQ sequentially in CC and was flat YoY. Positive momentum was noted in the UK BFSI sector and Germany, with strong deal pipeline visibility.
- ❑ APMEA was the standout performer, growing 3.1% QoQ and 8.8% YoY in CC, led by Southeast Asia. BFSI, technology, and communications sectors are gaining traction in this region.

Deal Wins and Order Book

- ❑ Total bookings for Q4 FY26 were \$3,455 million, up 3.2% QoQ in CC. Full-year total bookings reached \$16,449 million, up 14% YoY – the strongest booking year in recent history.
- ❑ Large deal TCV (deals ≥ \$30 million) for Q4 FY26 was \$1,440 million, surging 65.1% QoQ in CC. Full-year large deal TCV was \$7,829 million, up 45.4% YoY – the highest in at least five fiscal years.
- ❑ 14 large deals were signed in Q4 alone, totaling \$1.4 billion.
- ❑ Key strategic wins include a US health insurer contract extension for IT modernization, a global manufacturer multi-year renewal leveraging Wipro Intelligence™, TruStage retirement services transformation, ABB Group digital workplace renewal with agentic AI capabilities, and a Southeast Asian GCC establishment for asset operations.
- ❑ Post quarter-end, two strategic deals were announced: (1) the OLAM Group engagement – expected to exceed \$1 billion in contract value with \$800 million committed spend, encompassing end-to-end farm-to-fork transformation and the acquisition of MindSprint, OLAM's IT/digital arm; (2) a vendor consolidation deal with an existing top client. Both have been incorporated into Q1 FY27 guidance, with mid-quarter revenue contribution assumed.

Guidance and Outlook

- ❑ Q1 FY27 revenue guidance: \$2,597–\$2,651 million, implying sequential CC growth of -2.0% to 0%. This is the weakest guidance range in recent quarters.
- ❑ The soft guidance is attributable to: (a) continuing impact from the Americas 2 client-specific issue through Q1 (management confirmed full resolution post Q1); (b) delayed ramp-up of a previously won large deal; (c) seasonal Q1 weakness; partially offset by mid-quarter revenue contribution from the OLAM and vendor consolidation deals.
- ❑ Management indicated deal pipeline remains strong and secular across markets and industries, providing comfort on the medium-term growth trajectory.
- ❑ Q1 FY27 guidance exchange rate assumptions: GBP/USD at 1.34, EUR/USD at 1.17, AUD/USD at 0.70, USD/INR at 92.35, CAD/USD at 0.73.

WIPRO Q4FY26 Result Update

Margin Outlook and Headwinds

- ❑ Q1 FY27 will absorb two additional months of salary increase impact (only one month was absorbed in Q4 FY26).
- ❑ New large deal ramp-ups typically come with lower initial margins due to competitive deal structures and transition costs.
- ❑ Planned acceleration of investments in the newly launched AI Native Business & Platforms unit will create incremental cost pressure.
- ❑ Connected services capabilities (Harman DTS acquisition) continue to dilute near-term margins.
- ❑ Management has guided for potential quarter-on-quarter margin volatility but reiterated the medium-term objective of maintaining margins in a narrow band through operational efficiency improvements, productivity gains from AI deployment, and overhead optimization.

AI Strategy and Structural Pivot

- ❑ Wipro has launched a dedicated AI Native Business & Platforms unit, marking a deliberate pivot from a services-only model to a services-as-a-software approach. The unit will operate with dedicated leadership, focused investment, and a distinct operating model.
- ❑ Wipro Intelligence – the unified AI-powered platform suite – underpins delivery across run-and-operate (WINGS platform) and build-and-transform (WEGA platform) engagements.
- ❑ Management indicated that AI is being embedded across all new client engagements and is no longer optional. Productivity gains are most visible in software testing and coding, with AI advisory and consulting (led by Capco in BFSI) emerging as a meaningful revenue stream.
- ❑ The company is building AI-native platforms across healthcare, banking, insurance, telecom, and automotive verticals, and clients are increasingly requesting platform-based solutions over legacy approaches.
- ❑ AI revenue is currently not disclosed separately; management signaled this will likely remain the approach for now, though it acknowledged growing investor interest in the disclosure.
- ❑ Management rebutted analyst concerns about AI being a headwind to IT revenues (referencing the Anthropic Mythos model reports), noting that such models create opportunities for error identification and remediation alongside any productivity displacement.

Capital Allocation

- ❑ The Board has approved a ₹150 billion buyback (~\$1.6 billion) at ₹250 per share, covering 5.7% of paid-up equity capital – the largest buyback in the company's history. Completion is expected by Q1 FY28, subject to shareholder approval.
- ❑ Interim dividend of ₹11 per share (declared across two tranches in FY26) has been treated as the final dividend for FY26.
- ❑ For FY26, total cash returned to shareholders was \$1.3 billion in dividends, bringing the three-year cumulative payout ratio to 88% – well above the company's stated capital allocation policy.
- ❑ Management emphasized that the buyback represents return of excess cash and that sufficient reserves remain for M&A, large deal investments, and the AI platforms unit. Gross cash including investments stood at \$5.9 billion.

Demand Environment and Macro Risks

- ❑ Management characterized the geopolitical environment – including trade tariffs, immigration restrictions, and Middle East conflict – as the "new normal." Clients are increasingly baking such disruptions into their planning.
- ❑ No material direct impact from the Middle East conflict on Wipro's operations or client spend has been observed so far. A couple of client projects have been slowed down, but nothing material.
- ❑ In the manufacturing and auto sectors, clients are focused on supply chain resilience and visibility – an area where AI-led solutions present an opportunity for Wipro.

WIPRO Q4FY26 Result Update

- ❑ Tariff-led disruptions are putting pressure on manufacturing clients' input costs and consumer demand forecasting, leading to tighter IT budget scrutiny in pockets of the vertical.
- ❑ Energy & Utilities and Manufacturing (EMR) sector – contributing ~17% of revenues – has not seen a significant demand impact from geopolitical developments, though management acknowledged this warrants monitoring.
- ❑ Client spending decisions are increasingly tied to business outcomes, making deal pricing more outcome-based and competitive. Consulting-led, AI-powered positioning is Wipro's stated differentiation strategy.

Client Metrics and Concentration

- ❑ Top client revenue concentration declined to 4.3% of IT Services revenues in Q4 FY26, from 4.7% in Q3 – reflecting a sharp sequential decline in the account. Management attributed this to one-off quarter volatility and expressed confidence in recovery in coming quarters. On a YoY basis, the top client relationship has grown.
- ❑ Top 5 client revenues were slightly down QoQ but grew 0.2% YoY in CC. Top 10 grew 1.5% YoY in CC – management indicated no structural deterioration in key account relationships.
- ❑ The number of \$100 million-plus clients held steady at 16; \$50 million-plus clients remained at 45.

Inorganic Activity

- ❑ Harman DTS (connected services capabilities) acquisition is now fully integrated and included in all three months of Q4 FY26 numbers – no incremental contribution will be seen in Q1 FY27 from this deal.
- ❑ MindSprint (OLAM's IT arm) acquisition is in progress and forms part of the OLAM strategic deal. Revenue contribution has been assumed from mid-Q1 FY27 in the guidance.
- ❑ A second post-quarter deal – vendor consolidation for a top client – has also been factored into Q1 guidance from mid-quarter.
- ❑ Management indicated M&A will remain a tool for capability and market access expansion, with the balance sheet considered adequately equipped for future deal-making.

Workforce and Hiring

- ❑ Fresher hiring for FY26 totaled 7,500 – in line with guidance. Over 3,000 were added in Q4 alone.
- ❑ No fresher hiring targets have been set for FY27; management indicated hiring will be entirely demand-driven in the current volatile environment.
- ❑ Management acknowledged that campus intake has been declining over the last four years, and the shift toward domain-specific, AI-skilled hiring is structural and ongoing.
- ❑ The inverted pyramid structure of IT services is expected to evolve – management flagged a potential shift toward diamond or top-heavy models as AI reduces the need for large junior delivery teams, with implications for middle management layers.
